The East New York Farms! Project (ENYF) is a group of diverse gardeners, vendors, farmers, and youth working together to strengthen our community through gardens, fresh food, farmers markets, and community leadership development. ENYF is a program of the United Community Centers Inc (UCC). The mission of ENYF is to organize youth and adults to advance food justice in the East New York neighborhood of Brooklyn by promoting local sustainable agriculture and community-led development.

The ENYF Project Director will be responsible for leading the development of our food justice work in East New York.

Roles and responsibilities will include:

Internal leadership

- Coordinate and support efforts of four full-time staff members
- Create systems to increase the impact and efficiency of our work
- Partner with staff to develop and implement ways to evaluate our work, and adjust programs as necessary
- Coordinate ENYF programming with UCC's Executive Director

Community and External leadership

- Coordinate communication to members and supporters
- Organize leadership and skills trainings for members, primarily through our monthly member meetings
- Plan annual community events for our members and neighbors
- Pursue relevant opportunities to partner with local, regional, and national organizations and networks

Raising and Managing Funds

- Create annual fundraising plan, including researching appropriate funding sources
- Raise funds by writing grants and building relationships with funders and donors
- Maintain relationships with funders and donors, including submitting narrative and financial reports
- Create program budgets and track spending

Youth Internship Program

- Supervise a crew of youth interns (ages 13-18) to grow vegetables, assist other neighborhood gardeners, and help run the farmers' market
- Assist with designing and leading lessons to build skills and help youth understand the social context of their work
- Participate in regular feedback and evaluation of youth interns
- Our youth program is a well-established part of our work, and the Project Director will join four other staff members (including a Youth Program Director) in carrying out the program

Experience in a management position - supervising and supporting staff, running a program, setting priorities and coordinating efforts between different staff and program areas

Experience facilitating group discussions and group decision-making

Demonstrated commitment to participatory development in marginalized communities

Able to work in a physically demanding environment (working outside in all kinds of weather, lifting heavy things)

Able to work weekends (work week is Tuesday – Saturday from March – November, and Monday – Friday from December - February) and occasional evenings

Able to work a schedule that varies with the seasons, with longer hours from spring to fall (especially during July and August) and a lighter workload in the winter

Familiarity with East New York and ability to speak Spanish or Bangla are strong pluses

This position is open until filled, but interested candidates should apply as soon as possible. We plan to start interviewing strong candidates on a rolling basis during the fall and winter. We hope to hire a new Project Director to start in Spring 2013, and overlap with our current Project Director for at least two months.

This position offers a salary in the low \$40K range, medical and dental coverage, and paid vacation.
