This week I'd like to share how proud I am of our children and teachers in Year 6. You may or may not be aware, but a large number of schools across the country would be spending the Spring term worrying about SATs and teaching your children English and Mathematics, and nothing else. At Blackfield Primary school we believe in your children having fun whilst learning and making sure they are taught the breadth of the curriuculum and not just the subjects the government measures school performance on. We're able to do this because we stay true to our educational beliefs and because your children are so focussed and work so hard to achieve their potential. That's why our Year 6's spent this week immersing themselves in the ancient Greeks, rather than sitting practice papers every day.



Reading Tip of the Week – Guess work!

Ask your child to make predictions - Read the title and look at the cover, then ask your child to tell you what they think might happen in the book. Most children will be quite uncomfortable with this in the beginning, as they don't know the answer and they want to please you by saying only correct answers. Encourage them by saying that there is no wrong answer, but rather you just want them to take a guess. Getting children to think about why they have got to that conclusion and to use evidence from the book is a key skill which they need to learn!
